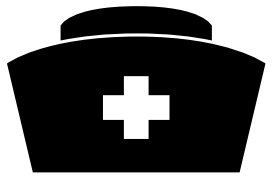
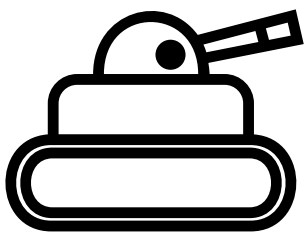




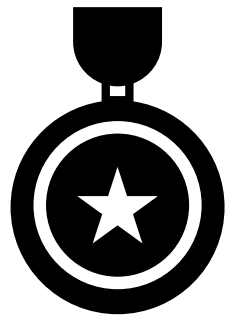
Graduated from Women's College Hospital School of Nursing in 1932



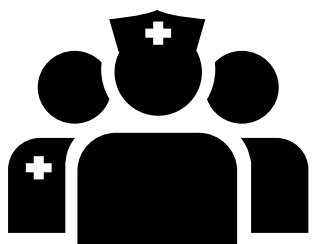
Enlisted in the army as a nurse when war broke out in 1939



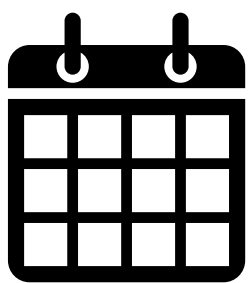
Treated various war injuries and illnesses across the globe in England, Sicily, Italy, France, Holland, and others.



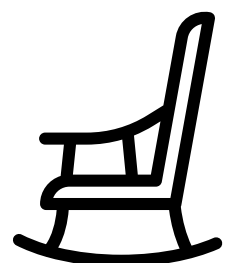
During her service, she rose to the rank of Major, received several military awards and ribbons, and was honoured with a medal from King George VI at Buckingham Palace
